A reminder notice: Fairfax will be holding another culture day on Friday, 12 July 2024. There will be a range of events taking place within classes on the day, for example:


- Tangrams in Mathematics China's most famous puzzle game.

#### **Uniform Reminder**

Please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform to support us to maintain high standards. In particular:

- Tailored trousers or tailored shorts and/or skirt (not tight fitting)
- Skirts are worn appropriately and only a few inches above the knee
- Plain black V-neck jumper or cardigan (no sweatshirts or hoodies)
- Blazer and tie (to be worn at all times)
- School shoes (not trainers)
- No jewellery (one pair of stud earrings only)
- No facial piercings (if students have a nose ring, it needs to be a clear, invisible one)

#### **July Punctuality Drive**

Good punctuality at school is essential for students to achieve their full educational potential. Arriving promptly to school ensures that your child does not miss work, and that disruption to the teacher and other students is minimised. Students who have persistent lateness will experience a significant loss in their learning time.

We regularly stress to students the importance of punctuality, not just to remind them of the learning time that is lost, but to inform them that having good punctuality is also vital in forming good habits for later life and employment. As such, we expect students to arrive to school punctually each day, ready to start tutor time or attend their weekly assembly.

The school day begins promptly at 08:30 with your child's form tutor taking the register. This means that students must be on site by this point. Students arriving after 08:30, will be asked to enter through gate 2 where they will be signed in by a member of staff.

Currently, students who are late on the third occasion in a half term receive a 30-minute detention and will receive a further 30-minute detention for each late that occurs in that same half term period. However, during our 'July Punctuality Drive', which takes place between Monday, 8 July and Friday, 19 July 2024, students who arrive after 08:30 will be escorted from gate 2 into the sixth form building where they will complete a reflection task During the remainder of the registration period. A further sanction may be added regarding students who are repeatedly late without a valid reason during the July drive. In this event, students will spend additional time in refocus which may run up to break-time. They will then sit a 30 minute detention after school.

We would like to thank all parents/carers for their ongoing support in this matter and for making sure their child is attending school regularly and are therefore benefiting fully from their educational opportunity.



# **Attendance Matters**

We extend our heartfelt thanks to both parents/carers and students for their exceptional attendance this term. Your dedication and ambition to being present and committed towards learning is truly commendable. As a result, we are proud to report that our attendance remains consistently above national average which is something that everyone who is involved with Fairfax is immensely proud of.
